PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

With graduation exercises just around the corner, some 6000 candidates for the degree in political science will be ready for the next stage in their careers. It is an opportune time to ask: What happens to political science majors? Where do they go from the classroom? What opportunities are uniquely theirs?

Most of the 6000 will doubtless move into activities that have no immediately apparent relationship to political science. A large percentage of the women will become housewives and many of the men will find their niche in the world of business. One can hope that their brief exposure to political science may contribute to their effectiveness as homemakers, businessmen, and citizens.

Pi Sigma Alpha graduates will tend to relate their training in political science more directly to their future activities. They should. They have been identified as that relatively small segment of students who show a special aptitude for their major field. It is they who will be the professors of government, the teachers of the social studies, the academic researchers, the public administrators, and the elected officials. It is from among them that the distinguished leaders of the profession will emerge.

It would be useful for our new initiates, this year and in years to come, to know more precisely than presently available data reveal, what opportunities actually do lie ahead for outstanding majors in political science. The individual chapters could assist greatly in such guidance by keeping records of the careers of their alumni. If there be curious and ambitious chapter officers who have been keeping or could compile such records, reports thereof would be most welcome at our Chicago headquarters.
