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Committee on Chapter Activities Requests Proposals for Grants

The Committee on Chapter Activities met on April 2 at the American Enterprise Institute. All the committee members appointed by the Council President, William Livingston, were present: Joseph L. Overton, Morgan State University; Howard Penniman, P.S.A. Director (ex officio member); Austin Ranney, A.E.I., Chairman; Joseph E. Thompson, Villanova University; and, Maurice Woodard, Howard University.

A full discussion among the members followed the Chairman's opening remarks on the committee's charge to study and recommend ways the national office can help chapters with their program activities. The chairman stated that it would be important to utilize the approximate \$5,000 for the greatest number of chapters. It was clear that these funds would be used as seed money.

The Director noted several ways by which the chapters could be funded as suggested during the 1980 general meeting in Washington, D.C. The committee urged that the funding should be done on a competitive basis. An individual chapter or group of chapters could submit a proposal to the Committee on Chapter Activities for competitive review.

Professor Thompson suggested that the proposals be considered within three general illustrative categories: 1) membership, 2) honor society affairs, and 3) service. First, the memberships classification includes those activities which increase the number of members in the chapter. Membership drives and events to attract more members could be a special political movie/lecture series, a seasonal picnic, a cooperative display or discussions with the department faculty, or career day discussions. These lists (here and to follow) are presented as examples and not as an all-inclusive inventory.

Second, the program activities of the honor society chapter (local, regional or national) engendered the longest discussion. Essay competition, newsletters or newspapers, campus debates, special speakers and luncheons, public service awards, political activism projects, trips, co-sponsored activities are a few of the ideas discussed by the committee as improving the quality of the honor society program activities.

Third, the service category could include providing speakers to area high schools or community groups to discuss political issues, conducting a campus poll to measure student interest in relevant civic topics, managing a bulletin board for information to the community, keeping a file and corresponding with alumni, and developing and arranging community exhibits. Some proposals may overlap these three illustrative areas. The committee also anticipates and welcomes proposals that may not fit neatly into any of the three categories.

On the operational process it was decided:

1. A chapter may submit as many proposals as it wishes. The Committee on Chapter Activities, however, will only grant one award to a chapter. This does not exclude any chapter from participating in a large cooperative regional grant of two or more chapters.
2. The proposal should range anywhere up to \$500.00.
3. The proposal must bear a postmark no later than October 15, 1981. This date will enable the committee to judge the proposals and reach a decision by November 15, 1981.
4. The proposal must be submitted on the *advisor's* official school letterhead. The description of the project and the estimated funds necessary for the success of the activity should be part of the fund request. There is no official form that must be completed during this experimental first year.
5. A written report on the project must be submitted to the committee on official school letterhead by the chapter receiving the award no later than six (6) months after the completion of the project.

The Committee on Chapter Activities will make its decision on the submitted proposals based on merit and overall impact of the proposal on improving the chapter(s). All those chapters receiving funds will also receive several extra copies of the *Newsletter* in which the award is briefly described.

In an optimistic spirit of anticipated workload, the committee awaits chapter proposal(s).

Annual Best Paper Awards

The Southwestern Political Science Association presented the 1980 annual \$100 Pi Sigma Alpha Best Paper Award to Professors Rory E. Miller and David A. Bostis of Southern Illinois University for their paper entitled "Social Psychological Characteristics and Telephone Interview Effectiveness."

The Midwestern Political Science Association at its business meeting on April 17, 1981, presented the 1980 annual \$100 Pi Sigma Alpha Best Paper Award to Professor Leslie F. Goldstein of the University of Delaware. His paper was entitled "A Critique of the Supreme Court's Abortion Funding Decisions."

The National Capital Area Political Science Association presented the 1980 annual \$100 Pi Sigma Alpha Award for interrelations of public service and political science to Evron M. Kirkpatrick, Executive Director of the American Political Science Association and Past President of Pi Sigma Alpha. The presentation was made by Jack W. Peltason, President of the American Council on Education and immediate past President of Pi Sigma Alpha. This is the fifth presentation of the award. Previous winners were Ernest Griffith, Francis Wilcox, Alan K. Campbell, and Donna Shalala.
